For students with IEPs and learning disabilities, what are ways they can get involved and have more social interactions?

Our case managers work in tandem with our teachers and our Club sponsors for our students to find a social network that is in line with their interests and hobbies. School counselors also meet with each case manager to specially design each student's schedule.

Have questions or concern? Reach out to our IST, Chelsea Depa, our IRR department chair, Caren Hart, and your student's case manager. A meeting specifically centered on the social aspect of navigating can be arranged with the team.

How will 9th graders be supported in making their Pathway decision?

The GT Block teachers starting after Thanksgiving Break will be supporting the students in class with guiding questions and activities that will assist them in making the best choice for them.

One good question to discuss with your student is... "If you are given a problem, what approach would you take to solve the problem?"

- If you take a hands on, build approach, engineering may be for you.
- □ If you take a people focus approach, health sciences may be for you.
- If you take technology based approach, information technology may be for you.

When and how will students be advised on after high school decisions (college and career)?

Junior meetings are currently taking place. All juniors should schedule a meeting with their counselors: <u>Book My Junior Meeting.</u>

These meetings cover information on the college application process, reviewing career choices, SAT/ACT information, GA Student Finance Commission, Naviance, Hope, Zell, Dual Enrollment, credit checks and much more.

Students can also expect to receive additional support in their senior year.

When will senior swag/gear begin to be offered for our rising seniors?

We are planning to start offering class rings and letter jacket information before the end of this semester with the hope that the vendor can start delivery in the Spring.
